Choms-luer to be owing and stand justly ind-bled unto the R<sup>h</sup> hono. the Lord prop<sup>y</sup> his heirs  
& Successors viz: Robert Cattlin in the Sum of Thirty pounds Sterling and Thomas Good &  
Stephen Coston in the Sum of Fifteen pounds Sterd. a piece to be Seized on their goods and  
Chattell Land and Tenements for the use of the Lord prop<sup>y</sup> aforesd.

The Condition being such that if the abovesd Robert Cattlin be of the good b-behaviour towards  
all good peopl- and more especially towards Thomas Gordon and family and will also make  
his personale appeare every Court holden in this County during pleasure ad also pay all  
Officers fees due from him then the abovesd Obligation to be void otherwise to remaine & to  
be in full force & - - - - -

The Jurors for the R<sup>h</sup> hono. the Lord prop<sup>y</sup> at a grand Jury held the second Tuesday  
In November last past doe present and find that Elizabeth Ellis the wife of John Ellis s<sup>on</sup>  
of this County Labourer hath feloniously stolen and carried away from the house of John Reed  
Saler of this County &c. while as the said John Reed lay upon his death bed and under pretence  
of visiting the sick did ad said he stole and carry away severall goods and Commodities from the  
said Reed viz: One Cloath Varge polticoats One Irish furoe Westcoate w<sup>th</sup> things the word with  
Other things Caried away unvallued, the things vallued worne on her back to the vallue of five  
hundred pounds of Cobacco and the same hath made vs off and detain'd from the Orphans of the  
said John Reed now his Lordships Attorney Couer and saith that the said Elizabeth hath  
Wickedly and feloniously contemned his Lordships good Laws & Institutions of this province  
as also the sacred and divine Lawes of Almighty God & ag<sup>t</sup> the publick peace Causes indigent  
May be entered ag<sup>t</sup> the said Elizabeth according to Law in that case provided & c.

Chon. And Elizabeth Ellis aforesd. in her proper person and for plea pleade not guilty and for her  
Creyall put her self upon the Countrey &c.

Upon which Command was given to the Sheriff of this County to cause to be had two and good & lawfull  
men of his Bayliwick by whom the truth of the matter might be the better known & who neither  
er. to receive or be caused ad-w-ll &c.

Now heard at this day to wit the 12<sup>th</sup> day of June in the eight<sup>h</sup> year of the Dominion of the R<sup>h</sup> hono.  
Charles the first among Douy 1689 and the aforesd Elizabeth Ellis to the barre and the  
Jurors of that Jury likewise caused viz: John West William Domcom George Sand John Heath  
William Waller William Richardson Hoppe Taylor Samuel Marchmont Thomas Morris  
John Jones Walter Calbert and John Barker who to say the truth in the promises being  
Elites Creyod and Sworn upon their Oaths do say wee of the Jury doe find Elizabeth  
Ellis guilty of fact Whereupon it was Ordered by this Court that Josias Seward and  
Samuel Okino Doe examine what Clothes the said Elizabeth Ellis had belonging to
