And John Ellis Son the husband of the afores^d Eliz^a Ellis ~~John Parson and Charles Taylor~~ ^{Robert Whaples & Sam^l Marchmont} and did acknowledge themselves in Opⁿ Court to stand ind^{ed} vnto the Lord prop^y his heire or Success^r viz^t John Ellis Sⁿ in the sum of Thirty pound Sterling Robert Whaples and Samuel Marchmont in the sum of fifteen pound Sterling apoynted to be paid on their goods & Chattels Land & Tenem^t for the use of the Lord prop^y aforesaid.

The Condition of this Obligation is such that if the above bound Elizabeth Ellis be of the good behav^r as also if the above bound John Ellis Sⁿ doth performe the foregoing Conditions made in the behalf of his wife Eliz^a Ellis that is to say that the said Elizabeth Ellis make her personall app^rances every Court here hold during pleasure and further that if the said John Ellis Sⁿ pay vnto William Morris of the Deviding Procks = Twenty five daies work when demanded as also pay all Officers fees as also that he the said John Ellis Sⁿ when performing the afores^d works that he find himselfe Coste and Accomodation during the said Course of Twenty five daies work that then the above Obligation to be void otherwise to remaine in full force & vertue &c.
