Whereupon it was Order<sup>d</sup> by this Court that Josias Seward and Samuel Collins both of this County doo examine what Coaths the said Elizab<sup>th</sup> Colbourn had b<sup>e</sup> longing to the Orphants of the said John Hood deced and that after Examinacon thereof so had taken And the same Vallued & appraised as to them shall seem most Conveni<sup>e</sup>l to make report thereof to the Justices of the No<sup>e</sup>l County Court to be holden the 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> Tuesday in August next

And it is further Order<sup>d</sup> that the said Elizab<sup>th</sup> Colbourn give sufficient Security as well for her b<sup>e</sup> haviour as for her app<sup>r</sup>arance every Court during pleasure Caused William Colbourn Currier the husband of the afores<sup>d</sup> Eliz<sup>a</sup> Colbourn John Pratten Hope Taylor and in open Court did acknowledge themselves to stand justly God-bled unto the R<sup>h</sup> hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord prop<sup>ty</sup> viz<sup>t</sup> William Colbourn afores<sup>d</sup> for his said wife in the Sum of thirty pounds sterling John Pratten Hope Taylor each in ffifteen Pounds sterling a piece to be Levied on their goods & Chattels Lands & Com<sup>m</sup>ents for the use of the Lord prop<sup>ty</sup> afores<sup>d</sup> &c.

The Condition of this Obligation is such that if the afores<sup>d</sup> Elizab<sup>th</sup> Colbourn doo of the good b<sup>e</sup> haviour and ab<sup>r</sup>arance and make her personall app<sup>r</sup>arance every Court during pleasure and if that her husband W<sup>m</sup> Colbourn afores<sup>d</sup> pay all Officers fees due from his said wife that then the afores<sup>d</sup> Obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force & virtue &c.
