by his Attourney Edmund Beauchamp humbly (prays) Order ag<sup>t</sup>. Raudall Reuell Son & heir of  
the said Raudall Reuell Sen. the said Raudall died having paid no part nor parcel in  
his life time nor since his death Nothing hath been paid the said Raudall Reuell being  
Adv<sup>er</sup>. Saith cannot pay without Order whereof he desires Order ag<sup>t</sup>. the adm<sup>r</sup>. for the s<sup>um</sup>. 1400:  
of Cobacco - will pray &c.

Upon hearing of the afores<sup>d</sup>. petition Ordered by this Court that Raudall Reuell adm<sup>r</sup>. of  
the estate of Raudall Reuell Sen. late of this County doo pay unto the afores<sup>d</sup>. John Reuell  
of Accomack in Virg<sup>a</sup>. or to his Orders the iust Sum of fourteen hundred pounds of Cobacco  
and Cash &c.

The Petition of John King & his Attourney Edmund Beauchamp Sheweth  
That whereas Mr. Raudall Reuell Sen. late of this County died & stood indebted to your petitioner  
One pair of french fells mens Shoes in the year of our Lord God 1685 came to 50. of Cobacco as  
also Mr. Cathorn Reuell in the year 1686 stood indebted to us for two pair of Womens Shooes  
amounting to One hundred pounds of Cobacco both w<sup>ch</sup> Sums amountes to 150. of Cobacco - Now  
your petitioner by his Attourney Edmund Beauchamp (prays and Saith) that nothing of the said hath been  
paid in the life time of the said Raudall and Cathorn nor since humbly (prays) Order ag<sup>t</sup>. the adm<sup>r</sup>.  
Raudall Reuell here present in Court who saith cannot pay without Order of Court & will pray &c.  
Upon hearing the afores<sup>d</sup>. Petition and the promises being taken into Consideration Ordered by this  
Court that Raudall Reuell adm<sup>r</sup>. do afores<sup>d</sup>. pay unto the afores<sup>d</sup>. John King the Sum of one hundred  
and fifty pounds of Cobacco as pray'd &c.

The Petition of William Richardson about the estate of Richard Harris w<sup>ch</sup> said petition was by  
this Court given in Charge to the Grand Jury as being business relating to Orphans but the said  
Grand Jury put it upon the Court againe who gave it No result &c.

Ordered by this Court that William Lamore and John Webb app<sup>er</sup>. heard to Morrow in Court  
Sitting to answer unto such things as shall be Objected against them &c.

The Petition of Thomas <sup>Loole</sup> ag<sup>t</sup>. the Widdow Fossett as adm<sup>r</sup>. of the estate of Jn<sup>r</sup>. Cropper  
That whereas the s<sup>aid</sup>. Jn<sup>r</sup>. Cropper in his life time became indebted to the Petitioner the Sum  
of 1700. of Cobacco as appears for w<sup>ch</sup> your petitioner humbly (prays) Order ag<sup>t</sup>. Rodiah Fossett  
as adm<sup>r</sup>. of the estate of Jn<sup>r</sup>. Cropper afores<sup>d</sup>. now dead for the s<sup>um</sup>. 1700. of Cobacco &c.  
John Cropper Dr for fetching Rich<sup>d</sup>. Calbert & his wife & Child from S<sup>t</sup>. Marks 1000.  
Co<sup>s</sup> the paid w<sup>ch</sup>. Underwood 400
