Ordered that Miles Grey and John Ferguson be summoned to appear before the Lord holden the s<sup>ec</sup>ond Tuesday in August next to shew if any they have why they should not stand according to Law for their contumacy in not making their personale appearance before this Court as being sumon=dt therunto on the b<sup>th</sup> halfe of the R<sup>t</sup> hono. the Lord prop<sup>ty</sup> ag<sup>t</sup> Jos<sup>e</sup>ph Boyce et<sup>r</sup> - - - - -

Ordered that if Maj<sup>o</sup> Ambrose London (now deceased) for any evindence on the b<sup>th</sup> halfe of the R<sup>t</sup> hono. the Lord prop<sup>ty</sup> ag<sup>t</sup> Jos<sup>e</sup>ph Boyce of this County shall a sumon be issued forth without delay et<sup>r</sup> - - - - -

Ordered that the Books of Law & Alphab=dt be the Clerk that now is et<sup>r</sup> - - - - -  
Ordered that every such person as ever brought in by way of judicium cannot bring any action of Slander or Defamation ag<sup>t</sup> any other person or persons untill first tried by this Court of the said judicium or prosequit et<sup>r</sup> if the said action be not first brought before judgment.

Richard Davis brought his Serv<sup>t</sup> man called Cornelius Mackenna to this Court to be judged the said Serv<sup>t</sup> having judgments but judged for his master after a full view had and by this Court taken of the said Cornelius Mackenna they doo adjudg him to be fiftoon yeares of age et<sup>r</sup>.
