That whereas your father<sup>r</sup> petitioner did before his death bind out his son Edward  
Bright by a certaine writing to serve with Nathaniel Dougherty or his assigne untill  
he shoulde arrive to the age of twenty one yeare upon the condicione mentioned in the  
said writing Now since it hath pleased God to take out of this world the said Dougherty  
& his wife your petitioner humbly graunte that the said Edward Bright may have  
liberty by this court to chuse himself another master & that whereas ther is sever  
lire & half & other things that are to be made good to severall of your petitioner othe  
brother<sup>r</sup> it is further prayed that the worshipfull court will be pleased to take care  
that those severall charges person<sup>s</sup> do enter into recognizance for the same &  
Whereupon it was ordered this day (sawt) the 13<sup>th</sup> day of June aforesaid that the  
infideling person<sup>s</sup> be summond ag<sup>t</sup> next Court upon heire acc<sup>t</sup> viz<sup>t</sup> Samuel Allopard  
Cornelius Ward & Mr<sup>r</sup> Taylor the Taylor who are accordingly summond

Court adjourned till to morrow morning eight of the clock
