John Ellis Jun. Inditement Read in
The Court for the 2nd time the 2nd of Apr. being upon the holy Evangelist at
a County Court holden the second Tuesday in June last past do present and find that John Ellis Jun.
of this County squire did in the Month of March and upon the third day of April last past clandestinely
and feloniously steal kill and carry away three barrow hogs whereof two of the said hogs
were two years & a half old and the other half a year old of the value in all of six hundred
pounds of Tob. which said hogs were kept and slitt in the left years and swallow forks ever
sitt and under sitt in the right ears which is the proper mark of John Culhens as also the said
John Ellis in the above said Month of March did feloniously and clandestinely steal kill &
carry away two young sheales of about Nyed Mouth Old crop and one slitt in the left ear
and upper naife in the right ear with a notch at the roots being the proper mark of George
Wilson and of the value of two hundred pounds of Tobaco whereof his Lordships Attourney
Gouso and sayes that the said John Ellis Jun. hath not only offended Almighty God damaged
and injured his Lordships good people and especially his nearest and best Neighbours by frequent
stealing and purloining their goods this being the second offence but also hath occasioned
scandall and given evil example to the good people of this province most iniuriously hath
contemned his Lordships good laws & justifications so that iudgment ought to be entered against
the said offender according to Law in that Case Provided James Singsler Esq. Justice
Upon which the said John Ellis Jun. appeared and sayes that he is no waies guilty of what
is laid to his charge and for his Excuse putt himselfe upon the Country whereupon it was
Ordered that a Jury be impaneled w. was by the Sheriff accordingly don viz. James Weatherly
Waiter Reed Francis Joyce Robert Gouch Thomas Eyre John Rennie John Larsons Nathaniel
Key John Hambley Maruaduck Mister Richard Webb & Dunmoch Dennis who being
impaneled and sworn to say the truth of the matter according to the Evidence of Robert
Hall James Browne who were also sworn and the Circumstances of George Wilson do
say that they find John Ellis Jun. guilty of all except that of George Wilson
Whereupon it was then and there Ordered that the said John Ellis Jun. pay to John Culhens
four fould being 2400. of Tobaco in payment of 600. of Tob. that the hogs were vallued all
as also that no receipt on his hand back were laden three stripes & that he stand in the
Pillory for two hours all which was executed
