Whereupon it unto the same Day directed by the said affter that his suid be remitted  
to the aforesaid Grato Garrett as prayed.

The petition of Sarah Griggs and the rest all Negroe shewing that they might putt out  
of the rest of Plantation from paying any Ruffe or being freed Servt Negroe Whereupon  
it was his said day Ordered that the four Women be discharged and that thmen pay deys  
for two years and that they bring a fortyside under the Ministeres haire wher they formerly  
did and or wrod servt that they are freed Negroe and Baptized etc - -

The petition of John Heath sheweth that whereas yo. petitioner by command from yo. Worships was  
ordered at this day to appear and procure his security accordingly yo. petition. has and will  
and is here ready to abide and obey your worships pleasure & command ac. come etc  
which said command was at the same day that whereas his Abordmeant Heath was the  
4<sup>th</sup> day of August bound to his good behauio. by Edmund Beauchamp and Mr. Starrett  
and James Alexander being bound for him in the presence of Com. Colborn David  
Brown & Robert King Esqrs of Londyn Justices of the peace and quorum for this County  
Now at this day to wit the 14<sup>th</sup> day of August ad aforesaid came the aforesaid John  
Heath in open Court ad alioz Symothay Harney & John sonnes the said John Heath standy  
indeed to the R<sup>t</sup> house the said propertie in the summe of forty pounds sterl. Symothay  
Harney in the summe of twenty pounds sterl. & John sonne in the summe of twenty pounds  
sterl. to be payed on their good chattels & Coniuicte etc

The condition of the above Recouered being such that if the abovesaid John Heath sh  
and or of the good ab. arancd ad alio. to keep his peace to no. Lordps and good people here  
in this County residing especially Edmund Beauchamp & his family for said you  
and aday to make his appearance every County Court during the next year  
and thus that then the above Obligation to be void otherwise to stand in full force & vert.

Court adjourned till to morrow morning 8. of the clock.

Upon which it was Ordered the same Day that the aforesaid Adam Heath be excused  
having shewn sufficient reason for his non apperance etc
