The petition of the said recognized being such that if the abovesaid Thomas Milman in any and shall be of the good behaviour & abstinence towards all his Lordships good people within this province & more especially towards his Lordships Justice of the peace within this County of ... that he the said recognized to be void otherwise to stand & remain in all force & power & the abovesaid recognized to stand in force for ...

The petition of John Johnson - *Endeavour day*

Shewing now that being bound for a grand Juryman to this Court and being a very sick and weak and so doth still continue with a quidding in his head and head be with a grievous Cough and he was not able to travel without hazarding his life therefore he prays his excuse - Whereupon his petition was granted by this Court provided that what he already done has done otherwise -

The same day

Caude John Heath who being bound to his good behaviour in open Court came his appearance

The 2th time the Lord property - *Endeavour day Leud ad aforaid*

Richard Harris & Susanna his wife - *Warr road*
Sheweth that whereas it is commonly reported that Richard Harris or his wife or both have by open ill and barbarous usage shortened the daies of a Negro girl called Anne Dlo caused the said Anne to be buried privately - Therefore in the name of the Rth Hon^{ble} the Lord property to will & require you immediately on sight hereof to apprehend the bodies of the said Richard Harris & Susanna his wife & them to bring before or sound either of his Lordships Justice of the peace for this County thereof to make answer to all such things as on the behalfs of his Lordships shall be objected against them hereof fails not as you will answer the contrary at your perils under my hand & Seal this 27th day of October 1688

Sheweth that whereas it doth or shall concern that we William Round foreman Nicholas ...
Richard Hill William Woulsham Edward Coward & Richard Warren all summoned this 23th day of October 1688 & Swore as a Jury of enquest by James Round out of his Lordships Court for this County aforaid to wait enquiry into the real cause of the death of a Negro girl aged 13 years or thereabouts who was slaved to Richard Harris during the Natural life of his wife which Negro girl as it is Godibly reported amongst the Neighbourhood hath been used after a very violent & barbarous manner by the said Richard Harris or his wife or both of them they stripping the said girl naked and laying her either to the well pold or well post did burie or cast her with straw till she was as crisp as roasted piggy as the report goes whereupon she was buried privately & as they now suppose more than a fortnight since in which time severall of the Neighbourhood heard made enquiry of the said Susanna Harris where her Negro girl was buried she humbly replied either that she was gone or that she was in being or the like alwaies concealing her death, & was the jury before mentioned being mett the day above written at the house of Richard Harris & there did open the grave & take up the Corp which was buried very shallow in the Earth in an obscure place by the side of a grate poplar in the Court side & throo three chunks of wood laid lengthwaids over the grave & open full view of her body doo find that from her waist downwards to her feet both before & behind lay upon her left Arm she hath been extremely buried in so much that most of the skin was spoiled &
