Richard Whitty pl.^r { Swindell Countyss John Poole of thd County was summond to answer
John Poole def^r { unto Richard Whitty of a pld^r of Crosspasse etc
From wherupon the said Richard Whitty by Edmund Beauchamp his Attorney saith
that in or about his mouth of May last past thd present year Amoy^r 1688 thd d^r John
Poole illogally took vp a certeine golding of thd plaintiff & him did ride without thd L^e and
payme of thd p^r. thd said golding being not returned to his pl^r thd pl^r saith he is damaged
for want of thd said golding to thd value of 1600. of Cobas. & therupon brings his Suit
And the said John Poole by his Attorney John Taylor cometh & defudith thd foyr
Inury whon & saith that thd pl^r his accoun^r he ought not to haue for that he did never ride
any horse of thd p^r ad in manor & foyrd declared neither did he see any brand markes of
Richard Whittie & Thordford putoth p^r to thd proofe of his Declaration etc
Upon which said both parties by thair Attorneys aforesaid & by mutuall couenant put thenselv^s
to thd iudgement of thd Court

Whereupon it is thd day to witt thd 14th day of November ad aforesaid considered by thd Court
that thd said Richard Whitty recover agenst thd said John Poole the sum of six hundred
pounds of Cobas debt recovered ad also thd sume of
fifties shillings & the def^r in Mercy etc

Court made oath vpon the holly Evangelist to thd Court
to thd aforesaid foyd acco^r that he reced no part
nor parcell thereof etc

Whereupon it was thd day to witt thd 14th day of November ad aforesaid Ordered that Thomas^r
Gordon ad admt^r of thd goods chattel & credits of thd Jonckin Morris^r & Margaret his wife late of
thd County deuid pay unto Capt^r William Lipper of thd County out of thd estate of thd said deuid the
sum of two hundred Ninty & Nine pounds of porks etc

Co portion of Stephen Foster of thd County desiringe his fynd might be remitted but would not be
granted for thd time etc

Co portion of William Elgate of thd County shewing that Margaret Morris^r the wife of Jonckin
Morris^r late of thd County deuid is indebted to your petitioner in the iust sume of two hundred pounds
of porks for foyr gallons of Rum at forty pounds of porks per gallon which thd said Margaret had of
your petitioner for which your said petitioner cravane an Order for thd same out of thd estate of thd said deuid
Paul & William Elgate & Edward in Open Court vpon the holly Evangelist that thd said sume is his iust debt
and due to him & that he never recd no part nor parcell thereof

Upon which it was ordered that Thomas Gordon ad adm^r of thd estate of thd said Jonckin Morris^r
Margaret his wife deuid the aforesaid sume of two hundred pounds of porks out of thd estate of
thd said deuid unto William Elgate aforesaid etc
