

The petition of William Glabourne Camer shewing that whereas your petitioner being summoned to the last Court as an Evidenced on the behalfs of the Lord prop^r against John Elliot your petitioner's wife being very sick and weak and not able to help her selfe and your poor petitioner not having any body to help her or look after her in your petitioner's Absence your petitioner was bound and constrained to provide for his wife in sickness and health whereupon your poor petitioner humbly begs you would be pleased to consider his condition & remitt his fine - - -
This Court having taken into consideration the petitioner's poverty it was ordered his fine to be remitted as prayed &c

Came John Bourd & in Open Court did acknowledge himselfe to stand indebted to the R^{ts} h^{on} Charles Lord Barron of Baltowrd in the full Sum of Twenty pounds sterl. and Lawrence Young did likewise acknowledge himselfe to stand indebted to the aforesaid Lord Barron of Baltowrd in the full and just Sum of forty pounds sterl. money of England to be levied on their Estates of theirs goods Chattels Lands & Commodities for the use of the Lord prop^r aforesaid
The condition of this Award required being such that if the aforesaid Lawrence Young shall will make his personall appearance at the next Court of adjournment to be holden the second Tuesday in December next there to answer unto what shall be objected against him on the behalfs of the aforesaid Lord Barron of Baltowrd & then there abide judgement according to Law that then the Award Obligation to be void of none effect otherwise to remain in force Power and virtue &c

Order for the Court

Whereas there was this day (to witt the 11th day of November ad aforesaid) an agreement made with William Vermabell Joyner in Open Court viz^t the said Vermabell to leave the Court house and to remove the stairs that now are & make anew stairs case in the next Inner Chamber the partition further in, &c make a Table for the Justice as a floor to make a seat for the Justice with a grate & Chair in the middle and a pewee over head the said Chair with my Lord's Coat of Arms to be fixed in the said Chamber with a Table & seats for the Clerk and the said and every part thereof to be well made according to platt he the said Vermabell to find planks Nails & all other Materials fitt for the said Chamber heere only excepted & in consideration thereof the said William Vermabell is to have five thousand five hundred pounds of Coban to be paid by the County & the said sum to be putt in in the next Lawy &c

Ordered that the Clerk that now is draw a Conveyance for the Com^{rs} Aids that belongs to the Court house which is to be drawen in the name of Cap^t David Browne Qui-Roger Wool for and to their Successors in place of Justice &c
