

The 11<sup>th</sup> day of November 1688 Com<sup>d</sup> as aforesaid 94

The petition of William Gl'dburne Damor shewing that whereas your petitioner being summoned to the last court as an evidence on the behalf of the Lord prop<sup>r</sup> against John Elliot your petitioner's wife being very sick and weak and not able to help her self and your poor petitioner not having any body to holp her or looke after her in your petitioner's absence your petitioner was bound and constrained to provide for his wife in sickness and health whereupon your poor petitioner humblye beggs you would be pleased to consider his condition & remitt his fine - - - - -

Wherefore having taken into consideration the petitioner's poverty it was ordered his fine to be remitted as prayed & - - - - -

And John Bound in Open Court did acknowledge himselfe to stand indebted to the R<sup>t</sup> hon<sup>d</sup> Charles Lord Barron of Baltoword in the summe of twenty pounds sterl. and Lawrence Young did likewise acknowledge himselfe to stand indebted to the aforesaid Lord Barron of Baltoword in the summe of forty pounds sterl. money of England to be leavyed on their Delivry of theirs goods & chattels lands & commodities for the use of the Lord prop<sup>r</sup> aforesaid

The judgment of the above recognizance being such that if the aforesaid Lawrence Young shall will make his personall appearance at the next court of adjournment to be held on the second Tuesday in December next thred to answer unto what shall be object<sup>d</sup> against him on the behalf of the aforesaid Lord Barron of Baltoword & then & thred to bid indigence according to Law that then the above obligation to be void & of no effect otherwise to remaine in force power and vertue &c

Whereas there was this day (to witt the 11<sup>th</sup> day of November) as aforesaid an agreement made with William Vennable to you in Open Court vizt the said Vennable to have the fourth house and to remoue the staires that now are made a new staire case in the next corner to remoue the partition further in, & to make a Table for the Justices as a place to make a seat for the Justices with a good chaire in the middle and a peale over head the said chaire with my Lord's coat of arms to be hanged in the same & above with a Table & seats for the Clerk and the said and every part thereof to be well made according to platt he the said Vennable to find planks Nails & all other materialie fit for the said timber door only excepted & in consideration of the said William Vennable is to haue two thousand two hundred pounds of Cobage to be paid by the County to the said summe to be putt in the next assay & - - - - -

Ordered that the Clerk that now is drawen for the County of York that belongs to the fourth house which is to be drawen in the name of Cap<sup>t</sup> David Browne Esq<sup>r</sup> Roger Woolfor and to their successors in place of Justices & - - - - -

Cause Lames given Robt Giv<sup>r</sup> Thomas Ackworth Edward Bennett John Goslin William Keene jun<sup>r</sup> Edward Craig David Harris & Thomas Gordon in Open Court made oath Upon the holy Evangelist on the behalf of the R<sup>t</sup> hon<sup>d</sup> the Lord prop<sup>r</sup> against Lawrence Young & John Tomp<sup>s</sup> upon which it was ordered that the foregoing Justices to be summoned ag<sup>t</sup> the next court of adjournment to be held on the second Tuesday in December next & - - - - -
