

In a County Court of adjournment held for the R. Hou. Charles the  
11<sup>th</sup> day of December in the 8<sup>th</sup> year of his Majesty's Dominion  
Amongst Douis 1688 before his Majesty's Justices thereunto Appointed  
and Authorized (viz) -

Whereas m<sup>r</sup> Stephen Luff was appointed to audit all accounts and regulate the Damages  
of the Action depending betwixt All-gauder Thomas adm<sup>r</sup> and Thomas Sarauord  
Comak's report thereof to this Court

Now at this day (to witt) the Eleaventh day of December as aforesaid came the aforesaid  
Stephen Luff and made this returne      November the 8<sup>th</sup> 1688

It Doo find and iudge that Thomas Sarauord ought to pay unto All-gauder Thomas one thousand  
pounds of Cobacco for Cost and Damages &c -      Stephen Luff -  
which Verdict being read was approved off by this Court and Ordered to be entered & confirmed

Ordered that Vicciau Steamord Bryan Iney and Francis Thomas be Sumoned to appear  
the next Court to answer to such things as shall be objected against them &c - - -

Came Francis Jenckins and made Appare to this Court by vertue of a bill under the hand  
and seal of Jenckins Morris Esq<sup>r</sup> of this County Dec<sup>d</sup> that the said Jenckins Morris beford  
his deat<sup>h</sup> becaus ind<sup>eb</sup>ted to him the said Francis Jenckins in the iust sum of Three hundred  
fifty and one pounds of Cobacco as p<sup>r</sup> said bill here in Court produced doth appare and whereas  
the said Francis Jenckins fraud an Order for the said 351. Tob<sup>o</sup>. ag<sup>t</sup> the adm<sup>r</sup> of the said  
Jenckins Morris afores<sup>d</sup>. And the said Francis Jenckins having sworn in open Court that the  
said debt of 351. Tob<sup>o</sup>. was due to him & that he never reced nor part<sup>ed</sup> nor parcell thereof

It was then there Ordered that Thomas Gordon adm<sup>r</sup> of the estate of the said Jenckins  
Morris doth pay unto the afores<sup>d</sup> Francis Jenckins the sum of Three hundred fifty and one  
pounds of Cobacco &c

Came Daniell Haste and fraud an Order ag<sup>t</sup> the estate of Jenckins Morris Esq<sup>r</sup> of  
this County Dec<sup>d</sup> for One hundred and sixty pounds of porke which the said Morris owed him  
As p<sup>r</sup> Acc<sup>t</sup> here in Court produced viz<sup>t</sup>

To one gale of Rum at 40 }  
To 2 gals. of Rum at 80 } 160 <sup>of porke</sup>  
To 1 gals. of Rum at 40 }

Whereupon it was Ordered that Thomas Gordon adm<sup>r</sup> of the estate afores<sup>d</sup> pay unto Daniell  
Haste one hundred & sixty pounds of porke &c

Came Nicholas Hountaine & George Lane in open Court did acknowledge themselves to  
each of them to stand ind<sup>eb</sup>ted unto the R<sup>th</sup> Hou<sup>se</sup> the Lord prop<sup>r</sup> in the iust and full sum of Cur<sup>r</sup>  
pounds st<sup>r</sup>ling ap<sup>e</sup> to be levied on their goods & Chattles Lands & Emments for the use afores<sup>d</sup>  
The Condition being such that if Thomas Looke of this County be of the good behav<sup>r</sup> &  
ab<sup>st</sup>rauct towards all his Majesty's good p<sup>r</sup>op<sup>r</sup> and especially towards Andrew Speer then  
the above Obligation to be void otherwise to remain in force &c
