ed that the foregoing charges may be deducted from the principle of the loan when the same is made; and provided further that in no case shall it be lawful to deduct interest in advance, nor make any charges for renewals or extensions of loans, not to divide or split up loans under any pretext whatsoever for the purpose of requiring or exacting any other or greater charges than presented herein. And any violation of the provisions of this Act shall be a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of one hundred dollars for the first offence and of a like fine and imprisonment in jail for 30 days, for the second and each subsequent offence, and further the entire amount loaned shall be forfeited to the borrower or borrowers and the mortgage therefor given become null and void.
