Also favorably, with proposed amendment,

Senate bill entitled "An Act to amend the charter and enlarge the powers of the Fidelity Fire Insurance Company of Baltimore city, a corporation formed under the General Incorporation Law of the State."

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

On line 3 of section 2, strike out the word "person" and substitute the word "power."

Which was read a second time.

Also, favorably,

House bill entitled "An Act to require all Turnpike Companies or other toll roads to keep a bright light thrown upon their toll bars or gates when down, during any hour of darkness."

Which was read a first time.

Also, unfavorably,

House bill entitled "An Act to amend the Act passed by the General Assembly of Maryland at its session of 1888, chapter 183, and amended by the General Assembly of Maryland at its session of 1894, chapter 562, entitled 'Maryland Asylum and Training School for the Feeble Minded.'"

Which unfavorable report was adopted.

Mr. Choate, from Committee on Agriculture, reported favorably,

Senate bill entitled "An Act to repeal section 2, of Article 86, of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Sheep and Dogs,' and to re-enact the same with amendments."

Which was read a second time.

Mr. Lehmayr, from Judiciary Committee, reported favorably,

Senate bill entitled "An Act to authorize Archie C. Holloway, of Worcester county, to settle his account as guardian to John L. Holloway, and to pay over all moneys due said ward."

Which was read a second time.
