19. Except as expressly provided in the preceding section, nothing therein contained nor any Act thereunder, shall change or affect the present rules of evidence or the present presumptions of law.

Section 2. Be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect and be in force from the date of its passage.

Which was read a first time.
