Which was read a first time.

Mr. Roberts, from Committee on Chesapeake Bay and Its Tributaries, reported unfavorably,

House bill entitled “An Act to repeal chapter 582, of the Acts of 1894, entitled ‘An Act to permit fishing with pound nets in the waters of the Chesapeake Bay from a point 200 yards westward from the extreme north end of Howell’s Point, to the north end of the broad beach at the mouth of the Little Pond Creek, and also to repeal sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 43, 44, 45, 90, 91, 92, 93, 94, 95, 96, 97, 98, 99, 100 and 101, of Article 39, of the Code of Public General Laws, title ‘Fish and Fisheries,’ and to add certain new sections to said Article to follow section, 12, to be designated as ‘Sections 12 A, 12 B, 12 C, 12 D, 12 E, 12 F, 12 G, 12 H, 12 I, 12 J, 12 K, 12 L and 12 M.’ ”

Which unfavorable report was adopted.

Mr. Lehmayr, from Judiciary Committee, reported favorably, with request that same be sent to Committee on Chesapeake Bay and Its Tributaries.

House bill entitled “An Act to repeal section 244, of Article 27, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title ‘Crimes and Punishment,’ sub-title ‘Rivers,’ and to reenact the same with amendments.

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Chesapeake Bay and Its Tributaries.
