Also, without recommendation, with proposed amendments,

House bill entitled "An Act to add two additional sections to Article 27, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled 'Crimes and Punishments,' to provide when wages are to be paid and to be arranged under the new sub-title 'Payment of Wages,' and to come in after section 149 of said Article, and to be known as 'Sections 149 A and 149 B.'"

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

In line 24, strike out the words "the people of."

In lines 25 and 26, strike out the words "Factory Inspector, in his name of office," and insert in lieu thereof the words "the State's Attorney or the several counties or the State's Attorney of Baltimore City, in the name of the State."

In line 27, strike out the words "Factory Inspector," and insert in lieu thereof the words "State's Attorney."

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Lehmayr, from Committee on Judiciary, reported unfavorably,

House bill entitled "An Act to declare unlawful and void all arrangements, contracts, agreements, trusts or combinations, made with a view to lessen, or which tend to lessen, free competition in the importation or sale of articles imported into this State, or in the manufacture or sale of articles of domestic growth or of domestic raw materials."

Which unfavorable report was adopted.

Mr. Lehmayr, from Committee on Judiciary, reported favorably, with proposed amendments.

House bill entitled "An Act to prohibit pool trusts, monopolies or conspiracies to control business and prices of articles; to prevent the formation or operation of pools, trusts, monopolies and combinations of charters of corporations that violate the terms of this Act, and to authorize the institutions of prosecutions and suits therefor."
