Montgomery county, of a certain lot of ground in the town of Brookeville, in said county, and to the holding of said lot by the said vestry of Saint John's Church, Saint Bartholomews Parish in Montgomery county, in fee simple, with full powers to dispose of the same."

On motion of Mr. Lehmeyer,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judiciary to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to repeal section 17, of Article 45, of the Maryland Code of Public General Laws, title "Husband and Wife." as repealed and re-enacted by the Act of 1898, chapter 457, and re-enact the same with amendments."

On motion of Mr. Wolfinger,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Education to introduce a bill entitled "A Act to repeal section 21, of Article 77, of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Public Education,' sub-title 'School Commissioners,' and to re-enact the same with amendments."

On motion of Mr. Collins,

Leave was granted to the Talbot county delegation to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to add additional sections to Article 21, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title Talbot County,' sub-title Justices of the Peace and Constables,' and to be designated as "Sections 117 A, 117 B, 117 C, 117 D, 117 E, 117 F, 117 G, 117 H, 117 I.'"

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments sections 232 A and 232 C, of Article 23, of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Corporations,' sub-title 'Telegraph Companies,' and relating to charges for telephone service, and the construction of telephones as the same were enacted by chapter 387, of the Acts of the General Assembly, passed January session, 1892."
