House bill entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments, section 31, of Article 43, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title 'Health,' sub-title 'Infectious Disease Small Pox,' and provide for the free vaccinations of pupils in the public schools of this State."

Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."

Also delivered,

Senate bill entitled "An Act to repeal section 2 of Article fifty-four (54) of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title 'Land Office,' and sections 11 and 15 of same Article as amended and re-enacted by Acts of the Assembly of 1894, chapter 191."

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
