Which was read a second time.

Also favorably,

Senate bill entitled "An Act to add certain new sections to Article 40 of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'General Assembly,' under the new sub-title 'Employment of Legislative Counsel and Agents and Return of Legislative Expenses,' to follow section 3, to be known as 'Sections 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14.'"

Which was read a second time.

Also, unfavorably,

Senate bill entitled "An Act to add certain new sections to the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Public Education' under the new sub-title 'Expenditures for Higher Education' to follow section 123, to be known as 'Sections 124, 125 and 126.'"

Which unfavorable report was adopted.

Mr. Collins, from Committee on Claims, reported unfavorably,

House bill entitled "An Act to refund to Samuel R. Owens, of Prince George's county, a certain sum of money erroneously paid into the State Treasury."

Which unfavorable report was adopted.

Mr. King, from Committee on Elections, reported without recommendation, with proposed amendment,

Senate bill entitled "An Act to amend Article 33, of the Code of Public General Laws, sub-title 'Elections,' as re-enacted by chapter 202, of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland 1896, by adding thereto twelve additional sections, under the sub-title 'Corrupt Practices,' to follow section 151, as now enacted."

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

By Committee on Elections, without recommendation.

Add at end of section 156.

"And any person, other than a member of a political committee, who shall engage in receiving or disbursing money for any of the purposes mentioned in section 155, of this Article, shall be decreed a treasurer of a political
