Said bill was then returned to the Senate.

Senate bill entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments sections 43 and 51 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, 1898, chapter 123, being Article 4 of the Code of Local Laws, title 'Baltimore City,' sub-title 'Charter,' relating to the collection of taxes."

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Section 43, in line 12 of engrossed bill to strike out all after the word "ground" to the words "the collector," on line 21, and insert in lieu thereof the following :

"And to properly describe said property, the city surveyor shall actually survey and furnish to the city collector a description and plat of each lot so in arrear, and the sum to be paid for each survey, including the description and plat shall be three dollars and fifty cents; said
