Endorsed "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."

Also,

House bill entitled "An Act to amend Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'City of Baltimore,' sub-title 'Sabbath' by adding thereto certain new sections to follow immediately after sections 807, and to be numbered 807 A, 807 B and 807 C."

Endorsed: "Reported unfavorably by Committee on Judicial Proceedings and report adopted."

Also,

House bill entitled "An Act to add two additional sections to Article 93 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled 'Testamentary Law,' to provide for payment of decedent's wages without administration and be arranged under the head 'Administration' in said article."

Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays as amended."
