House bill entitled "An Act to add two additional sections to Article 27 of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Crimes and Punishments,' under the new sub-title 'Protection of Employees' to come in after section 169, and to be known as '169 X and 169 Y,' to forbid employers from restraining and preventing employees from joining labor organizations, and providing a penalty for violation thereof."

Endorsed "Reported unfavorably by Committee on Judiciary, and report adopted."

Also,

House bill entitled "An Act to sanction a transfer of a bequest in the last will and testament of Dr. John Gunby, late of Worcester county, deceased, by the Trustees or Committee of the McKennie Memorial Church of Worcester county, to the Trustees or Committee of the Gunby Presbyterian Church of Worcester county, and to make valid said bequest."
