

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Strike out the word "residents," in line 9, and substitute "registered voters."

Mr. Duncan submitted the following proposed amendment:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

1. Insert after the word "years" on the second page of the bill, line 16, the following words: "And their term of office shall commence on the first Monday of May next ensuing their appointment."

2. Insert after the word "State," on the 57th line of the 3rd page of the bill the following words:

"Provided that the present Board of Police Commissioners shall continue in office until the first Monday of May, 1900, with the right of removal and to fill vacancies on the part of the Governor, as provided by law."

All of which were severally read and adopted.

Mr. Latrobe, as Chairman of the Committee of the Whole, reported the said bill with proposed amendments with recommendation that they be adopted and bill passed.
