not more than one hundred dollars and imprisoned not more than sixty days, or both fined and imprisoned in the discretion of said justice or court.

"Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage."

Which amendment was adopted.

The bill, as amended, was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

BILLS-THIRD READING.
