Mr. Bramble, from the Committee on Federal Relations, reported unfavorably,

The following Joint Resolution.

Resolved, That while feeling equal sorrow and regret for the loss of life among the gallant burghers of South Africa and the brave British soldiers, and condoling with those who sit and weep in England and in the Transvaal for the loss of their loved ones on the battle field, it is the sense of the General Assembly of Maryland, that the cause of the burghers is as just as was the cause of the American Colonies in 1776, and ought to succeed; that they are entitled to their independence and that in their struggle against the tyranny of an arrogant cotorie now controlling the British Government, they have the warmest sympathy of all lovers of liberty.

Mr. Robinson moved to substitute the resolution for the unfavorable report.
