Also,

Leave was granted to the Worcester county delegation to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments sections 23, 24 and 29, of chapter 189, of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January session of the year 1892, entitled 'An Act to repeal sections 202 to 215, both inclusive, of Article 24, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title 'Worcester County,' sub-title 'Pocomoke,' and to re-enact the same with amendments, and also to add thereto six additional sections to be known as 'Sections 23 A, 26 A, 26 B, 29 A, 29 B and 29 C.'"

On motion of Mr. Collins,

Leave was granted to the Talbot county delegation to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to repeal section 26, of Article 21, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'Talbot County,' sub-title 'Liquors and Intoxicating Drinks,' and re-enact the same with amendments."

BILLS—FIRST READING

The Secretary of the Senate appeared and delivered the following message:

Senate bill No. 32, entitled "An Act to repeal section 3, of chapter 704, of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, of the session of 1892, entitled "An Act to provide for the assessment and collection of a tax upon distilled spirits, and to re-enact said section 3, so as to read as follows; and also to add an additional section to said chapter 704, to be known as 'Section 12.'"

Which was read a first time, and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Senate bill entitled "An Act to enlarge the powers and privileges of the New York, Philadelphia and Norfolk Railroad Company."
