On motion of Mr. Knott,

Leave was granted to introduce a bill entitled an Act supplementary to an Act passed January session, 1894, chapter 562, entitled "An Act to change the name and amend the charter of the visitors of the Asylum and Training School for the Feeble Minded of the State of Maryland, and to appropriate a sum of money for the benefit of said asylum."

Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, hereafter to be appointed.
