Leave was granted to the Committee on Ways and Means to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to add 7 additional sections to Article 56, title 'Licenses,' of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Traders,' to regulate business in cities having a population of fifteen thousand or over, declaring it unlawful and making it a misdemeanor to transact business in violation of the provisions thereof, and provides the penalty for such violation, to come in after section 54, and to be known as 'Sections 54 A, 54 B, 54 C, 54 D, 54 E, 54 F and 54 G.'"

On motion of Mr. Hanson, (by request,)

Leave was granted to the Committee on Roads and Highways to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to establish a Board of Sidepath Commissioners, and to provide revenue for the repair and construction of sidepaths for bicycles and protect the sidepaths from injury and trespassers."
