LEAVES TO INTRODUCE BILLS.

On motion of Mr. Johnson,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Pensions, to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to authorize the Board of Police Commissioners of Baltimore city, to increase the pension of Williams H. Mills, a retired policeman of the police force of Baltimore city."

On motion of Mr. Bramble,

Leave was granted to Committee on Ways and Means, to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to accurately re-establish the boundaryline between the State of Maryland and the State of Pennsylvania, commonly called 'Mason and Dixon's Line,' and to re-mark the same, wherever necessary, with suitable monuments, and to make an appropriation therefor.'
