the pension of Alexander Slayson, a retired patrolman of the police force of Baltimore city."

On motion of Mr. Mitchell,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judiciary to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to repeal section 252, of Article 27, of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Crimes and Punishment,' sub-title 'Telegraphs," and to re-enact the same with amendments."

On motion of Mr. Robinson,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judiciary to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to add two additional sections to Article 27, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled 'Crimes and Punishments,' under the new sub-title 'Protection of Employees,' to come in after section 169, and to be known as '169 X and 169 Y,' to forbid employers from restraining and preventing employees from joining Labor Organizations, and providing a penalty for the violation thereof.'

On motion of Mr. Long,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Ways and Means to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to repeal section 31, of Article 81, of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Revenue and Taxes,' sub-title 'Collectors,' and to re-enact the same with amendments."

On motion of Mr. Long,

Leave was granted to the Washington county delegation to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to add additional sections to Article 22, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'Washington County,' sub-title 'County Commissioners,' to follow section 101, and to be designated respectively as 'Sections 101 A, 101 B, 101 C, 101 D, 101 E, 101 F, 101 G, 101 H, 101 J, 101 K, 101 L, 101 M, 101 N, 101.0, 101 P, 101 Q, 101 R, 101 S, 101 T, 101 U, 101 V, 101 W, 101 X, 101 Y, 101 Z, 101 AA, 101 BB, 101 CC and 101 DD.'"

The Secretary of the Senate appeared and delivered the following message:

Senate bill entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments section 83, of Article 19, of the Code
