Legislature to the gifts, devises and bequests to divers charitable and religious institutions named in the last will and testament of Dodaise Dode, late of Baltimore city, deceased, subject to the conditions and limitations and for the purposes in said will mentioned and to prevent any failure of the testamentary purposes of the said Dodaise Dode by reason of uncertainty or misdescription of any of said beneficiaries."

Also favorably, with proposed amendments,

House bill entitled "An Act to add an additional section to Article 24, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled 'Crimes and Punishments,' to come in after 208, sub-title 'Minors Care and Protection of,' and to be known as 'Section 208 A.'"

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

After the word "purposes," in line 13, strike out the word "last," and insert in lieu thereof the word "herein."
