

capacity of a practitioner of medicine or surgery, except such person shall openly profess and publicly be known to be acting as such agent, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction by any Court having criminal jurisdiction shall be punished by imprisonment in the city or county jail, for not less than thirty days nor more than one year, or by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, or both, in the discretion of the Court for such offense.

Section 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
