House bill entitled "An Act to regulate the practice of pharmacy in the State of Maryland."

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Strike out "Section 1" as offered, and insert the following:

"Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That persons on or after the first day of July following the passage of this Act, shall open, conduct or keep a pharmacy in this State, either as principal or agent, unless such persons shall have obtained a pharmacists' license as hereinafter provided, and no pharmacy shall, at any time, be left in charge of any person who is not a licensed pharmacist, a licensed acting pharmacist or a licensed assistant pharmacist; it shall, however, be lawful for physicians to compound and dispense their own prescriptions, but unlawful for any person, dealer or firm, not a licensed pharmacist, a licensed acting pharmacist or
