Leave was granted to the Baltimore county delegation to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to prohibit the license for sale of spirituous or fermented liquor or lager beer in the village of New Market, Maryland."

Leave was granted to the Baltimore county delegation to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to amend the Code of Public Local Laws, Article 3, title 'Baltimore County,' sub-title 'Primary Elections,' as amended by chapter 261 of the Acts of 1892, by adding a new section thereto, to follow after section 9, and to be designated 'Section 9 A.'"
