On motion of Mr. Truitt, of Baltimore county,

Leave was granted to the Baltimore county delegation to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to repeal chapter 252, of the Acts of 1896, entitled 'An Act to prohibit the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer within half a mile of the junction of Gettings Avenue and Belona Avenue, in Baltimore county.'"

On motion of Mr. Choate,

Leave was granted to the Baltimore county delegation to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments sections 4, 6, 10 and 16 of chapter 334, of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January session in the year 1890, entitled 'An Act to regulate the sale and the granting of license for the sale of spirituous and fermented liquors in Baltimore county;' and also to repeal chapter 436 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January session, in the year 1896, amendatory thereto; and also to add 3 new sections to said chapter 334 of said Acts of 1890, entitled as aforesaid, to come in after sections 21, and to be designated as 'Sections 21 A, 21 B and 21 C, respectively.'"

On motion of Mr. Sanford,

Leave was granted to the Baltimore city delegation to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to amend Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title 'Sabbath,' by adding thereto certain new sections, to follow immediately after section 807, and to be numbered '807 A, 807 B and 807 C.'"

On motion of Mr. Finzel,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judiciary to introduce a bill entitled "An Act to grant certain bequests to religious corporations."
