AMENDMENT PPOPOSED.

By Committee on Judiciary,

Strike out all after the word "a bill" in line 1, and insert in lieu thereof, the following:

Entitled "An Act to repeal sections 1, 3 and 31, of Article 59, of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Lunatic and Insane,' and to re-enact the same with amendments.'"

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section 1, 3 and 31, of Article 59, of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Lunatics and Insane,' be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted, so as to read respectively, as follows:

"1. When any person is alleged to be a lunatic or insane and without sufficient means to pay for his or her maintenance at an asylum and who has no relative or relatives or others legally chargeable with his or her support, the County Commissioners of the county in which such person may reside or the Supervisors of City Charities of the Department of Charities and Corrections of the city of Baltimore (if such person reside in the city of Baltimore,) shall, upon the written certificates
