After the word "oysters" in line 11, "any citizen of St. Mary's or Calvert counties desiring to take or catch oysters with tongs, may apply to the Clerk of the County of which he is a resident, for a license to take oysters in the Chesapeake Bay or Potomac river during the time allowed by the General Oyster Law and such license shall be good for the entire oyster season."
