to borrow money for that purpose, to issue bonds for the payment of the same, and to levy taxes on the assessable property in said county to redeem said bonds and to pay the interest thereon."

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Collins, from Select Committee, reported favorably.

House bill entitled "An Act to more definitely define the waters in Talbot county where oysters may be taken with scrape, scoop or dredge, by residents of Talbot county."

Which was read a first time.

Also, favorably,

House bill entitled "An Act to prohibit the clerk of the Circuit Court for Talbot county from issuing license to any person or company of circus riders, equestrian performers or to any person or company to exhibit for reward any animal or animals or natural or artificial curiosities (except models of useful inventions) during the months of August, September and October (except to fair associations or persons authorized by them) and providing penalties for such unlicensed exhibitions."

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Hopkins, from Select Committee, reported favorably,

House bill entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments, sections numbered 140, 141, 144, 151, 163 and 175, of Article 13, of the Public Local Laws, title 'Harford County,' sub-title 'Havre-de-Grace,' and sections numbered 142, 143, 145, 150, 152, 155, 156, 157, 158 and 159, of chapter 180, of the Acts of Assembly of 1890, entitled 'An Act to repeal sections 142, 143, 145, 150, 152, 155, 156, 157, 158, 159, 183, 186, 187 and 192, of Article 13, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'Harford County,' sub-title 'Havre-de Grace,' and to re-enact the same with amendments, and to repeal sections 175 and 176, of said sub-title, and to add new sections to such sub-title to be numbered 150 A, 150 B, 150 C, 150 D, 152 A, 155 A, 155 B, 156 A, 157 A, 157 B, 157 C, 158 A, 158 B and 159 A, and to authorize and empower the Mayor and City Council of Havre-de-Grace to issue bonds to the amount of \$20,000 to raise money to extinguish
