police justice of the peace of districts 3, 17, 21, 22, 24 and 25, of said county shall be the same as herein allowed to justices of other districts, but shall be taxed, collected and accounted for by him as in the preceding sections of this Act provided. And any justice of the peace other than the police justice of the peace in the districts 3, 17, 21, 22, 24 and 25, who shall issue a warrant of arrest for any person charged with a violation of law shall be allowed the sum of 10 cents for issuing said warrant, and all other service he may render in said case, and the said police justice shall be allowed the sum of 10 cents for all services he may render in a civil suit.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That all Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, and that all appointments of constables for any one or all of the districts 3, 17, 21, 22, 24 and 25 heretofore made, are hereby declared null and void, and this Act shall take effect from the first day of May, 1902."

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Deets, from Select Committee, reported unfavorably,

House bill entitled "An Act to add to Article 48 of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Inspections,' a new sub-title to be known as 'Steam Locomotive Boilers,' and new sections thereunder to be designated as 'Sections 66, 67, 68, 69, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75 and 76,' providing for the inspection of steam locomotive boilers, and to create the office of State Boiler Inspector of Steam Locomotive Engines."

Which unfavorable report was adopted.

Mr. Robinson moved to reconsider the vote by which said unfavorable report was adopted.

Which motion prevailed.

He then moved to substitute the bill for the unfavorable report.

Which motion was rejected.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES.
