and 61, of Article 43, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled 'Health,' sub-title 'Practitioners of Medicine,' be, and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments, that sections 49, 51 and 62 of said Article be, and the same are hereby repealed altogether, and that new sections be, and the same are hereby added to said Article, to be designated respectively, 'Section 40 A, to follow section 40, section 61 A, to follow section 61, and section 64, to follow section 63, and to read as follows:"

38. "All persons now practicing medicine and surgery, or who shall hereafter begin to practice medicine and surgery in any of their departments, except dentistry, in the State of Maryland, shall possess the qualifications required by the sub-title of this Article."

40. "From and after the first Tuesday in June, 1892, there shall be and continue to be two separate boards of medical examiners for the State of Maryland, one representing the Medical and Chirurgical Faculty of the State of Maryland, and one representing the Maryland State Homeopathic Medical Society. The members of said respective boards in office at the time when this law shall go into effect, shall continue to hold and exercise their respective offices up to the first Tuesday in June, 1900."

On the first Tuesday in June, 1900, said two boards of medical examiners shall be reorganized, and thereafter. said boards shall be constituted as follows: "Each of said boards shall consist of seven members, who shall be elected by the Medical and Chirurgical Faculty of the State of Maryland, and the Maryland State Homepathic Medical Society, respectively, at the annual meetings of said respective societies; and each appointee is immediately, after his election, to be furnished with a certificate thereof by the society electing him. Each such member of said respective boards, except those elected in the year 1900, shall serve for four years and until his successor is appointed and qualified. At their respective annual meetings held in the year 1900, each of said aforementioned societies shall elect the full number of seven examiners for its respective board, of whom two shall be elected for four years, two for three years, two for two years and one for one year, and thereafter such examiners shall be elected by each society in each year as oc-
