of the Senate, as established by its present Rules, and that to said committee (when appointed) shall be referred all bills whether of a local or general character, designed to regulate the time and manner of taking, killing, or trapping game and fish within this State, except such bills as are properly referable to the Committee on the Chesapeake Bay and its Tributaries."

Which was read, and referred to the Committee on Rules.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS.

A bill entitled "An Act to legalize the Supplement to the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, containing the General Laws of Maryland, passed at the session of the General Assembly of 1890, 1892, 1894, 1896 and 1898, as codified, printed and published by John Prentiss Poe, and to make the same evidence in the courts of this State, and before all the Justices of the Peace of this State, and all public officials of this State."

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

A bill entitled "An Act to declare the sanction and consent of the General Assembly of Maryland, to the several deeds made by Samuel Appold and wife, Gabriel D. Clark and wife, and William Kammerer, to the trustees of St. Mark's English Evangelical Lutheran Church of Baltimore, a corporation duly incorporated under the laws of the State of Maryland, and also to the acquisition hereafter by the said grantee of the fee-simple title to any lot of ground mentioned in said deeds in which it has thereby acquired less than a fee-simple, and to the selling, mortgaging, leasing or other disposition thereof."

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.
