Mr. Bouic, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported favorably Senate bill No. 11.

Entitled "An Act to add a new section to Article 35, of the Maryland Code of Public General Laws, entitled 'Evidence,' to follow after section 35 of said Article, under the sub-title 'Proof of Consideration,' and to be known as 'Section 35 A.'"

Which bill was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

Strike out all after the words "a bill" and insert

"Entitled An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments, sections 740 and 741, of Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'City of Baltimore,' sub-title 'Police Commissioners,' as said sections were enacted by chapter 123, of the Acts of 1898."

"Section 1. Re it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That sections 740 and 741, of Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Baltimore City," sub-title "Police Commissioners," as amended and re-enacted by the Act of 1898, chapter 123, be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments, so as to read as follows:

740. "There shall be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, three sober and discreet persons who shall have been residents
