Mr. Applegarth, from Committee on Chesapeake Bay and Tributaries, reported favorably,

House bill entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments sections 244, 245, 248, 249, 250 and 251, of Article 10, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'Dorchester County,' sub-title 'Oysters,' and to repeal and re-enact with amendments sections 155, 156, 159, 160, 161 and 162, of Article 21, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'Talbot County,' sub-title 'Oysters,' as said sections appear respectively in Volumes 1 and 2 of the Code of Public Local Laws, and all amendments and re-enactments of said sections in the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, since the codification of the laws in 1888, said sections being co-ordinate sections of law applicable to the waters of the Choptank river in common between Dorchester and Talbot counties."
