House bill entitled "An Act to prohibit the shooting of wild fowl between the first day of May and the tenth day of October, in the waters of the Great Choptank river and its tributaries lying wholly within the limits of Trappe District, in Talbot county, Md."

Which was read the second time.

Also, favorably,

House bill entitled "An Act to amend Article 11 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title 'Frederick County,' sub-title 'Wolves and Foxes,' by adding three additional sections thereto, to follow section 460 of said Article, and to be designated as 'Sections 460 A, 460 B and 460 C.'"

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Bouic, from Committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported favorably,

House bill entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments, section 184 C, of Article 2, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title Anne Arundel County,' subtitle "Liquors and Intoxicating Drinks."

Which was read the second time.

Also favorably, with proposed amendments,

House bill entitled "An Act to declare the sanction and consent of the General Assembly of Maryland, to sundry gifts, bequests and devises contained in the last wills and testaments of certain persons deceased, and also to certain gifts, grants, sales, leases and deeds made by various persons, to and for the use and benefit of sundry ministerial persons, religious corporations, educational institutions or sects, and to certain charitable institutions hereinafter named."
