of Medical Examiners and to regulate the fees and emoluments thereof, to prevent the practice of medicine and surgery by unauthorized persons, and to provide for the trial and punishment of violators of the provisions of this Act by a fine or imprisonment, or both, and to repeal and re-enact with additions and amendments sections 39, 40, 41, 45, 49, 53, 56, 58 and 59, of Article 43, of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Health,' subtitle 'Practitioners of Medicine,' and to repeal all laws or parts of laws in conflict or inconsistent with this Act, and to add additional sections thereto to be designated as 'Sections 39, 40, 41, 43, 49, 53, 56, 58 and 59.'"
