BILLS—THIRD READING.

Senate bill No. 1, entitled "An Act to add certain new sections to Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'City of Baltimore,' sub-title 'Police Commissioners,' providing for the creation of a Board of Police Examiners for the city of Baltimore, defining and prescribing the duties thereof and regulating appointments, promotions, reductions in ranks, transfers in and removals from the police force of said city; said sections to follow section 745, and to be designated as "Sections 745 A, 745 B, 745 C, 745 D, 745 E and 745 F."

Was read the third time, and passed by yeas and nays as follows:
