INTRODUCTION OF BILLS.

A bill entitled "An Act to appropriate twenty-five hundred dollars, to be expended for the repairing, refitting and furnishing of the Court of Appeals rooms and offices."

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Finance.

Also,

A bill entitled "An Act to provide for the acquisition of a lot of land and the erection thereon by the State of Maryland, of a building in the city of Annapolis, in which shall be located the court-room, consultation and other rooms of the Court of Appeals, the State Libary or portion thereof; the Comptroller's office, the Land Commissioner's office, the Tax Commissioner's office, the Treasurer's office; and for such other purposes as may be deemed proper, and to appropriate a sum of money therefor, and to provide for the removal of the building upon State House hill, known as the 'Comptroller's Office.'"
