motion, House resolved itself into Committee of the whole and adopted amendments and passed bill by yeas and nays as amended."

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

Also,

House bill No. 7 entitled "An Act to provide for the creation of a Board of Police Examiners for Baltimore city, to define and prescribe the duties thereof, and to regulate appointments to, promotions, reductions in rank, and transfers in and removals from the police force of said city, and to repeal all Acts and parts of Acts inconsistent with this Act, said provisions to be a part of Article 4, Public Local Laws, sub-title 'Police Commissioners,' and to be numbered sections 745 A, 745 B, 745 C, 745 C, 745 D, 745 E and 745 F."

Endorsed: "Considered on third reading, and on motion, House resolved itself in Committee of the Whole and adopted amendments, and passed the bill by yeas' and nays, as amended."

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.
